THE ANNUAL MEETING

The blessings on Christ Church were abundant in 2008. On February 1, we gather in worship as one community at 10 AM, and then reconvene in the Annual Meeting at 11:15 to review the year past and make plans for the future.

Consider the Annual Meeting as a shareholder meeting. By tradition, once a year, the Wardens, Vestry and Rector report and make transparent to membership all the temporal and business matters of the parish, as well as enter into the record reports on all of our ministries.

I always find it odd to think of Christ Church as a business, but, of course, we are Philadelphia's oldest small business, in continuous operation for 313 years, doing today what our 39 founding families set out to do in 1695. That is testament not only to the providence of God, but the savviness of the congregation for centuries.

With the stock market declines, and the economic hardships that so many experienced last year, the budgets of Christ Church were challenged. Thankfully, the congregation will receive the report that we finished 2008 with a balanced budget, and no deficit!

We will grapple with the realities of the 2009 budget which will be more challenging than 2008. To protect our very modest endowment in the current times, we will reduce our withdrawal by more than \$100,000 this year, and we still have pledges to secure to balance our 2009 budget. We have started many cost saving measures (the *Beacon*, for instance will only be coming 7 times a year), and more cost reductions will be necessary.

We will want to celebrate that last May marked the completion of the most comprehensive preservation and renovation project on our hallowed church building in generations, and we now have a high-tech, sophisticated fire suppression system, inside and out. In Neighborhood House, we have completed the costly electrical upgrade that powers the new fire pumps in the church, rebuilt the roofs, installed a new second stairway to have a safe, code compliant emergency exit, and repaired much of the building's masonry. But the most significant project--an elevator, a new accessible entrance, and major systems improvements is before us. Our Capital Campaign has raised more than \$6 million in the last several years--an amazing accomplishment--and we must decide whether this is the time to proceed with Neighborhood House construction even with the economic slowdown and limited access to new funding. The congregation will get a full report on the Vestry's deliberations and decisions.

Even though a business meeting, the Annual Meeting is really about the ministry of Christ Church, of how we give ourselves away, of how we inspire, nurture, heal and transform, of how we welcome the visitor and seeker, and challenge the comfortable. This is the time we gather to remind ourselves of how we make possible all that God has called us to do.

Don't worry. We'll be home long before the Super Bowl.

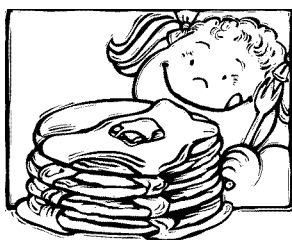

Guatemala Mission Trip 2009

Looking for an opportunity to reach out and serve Christ in the world? Christ Church and St. Peter's Church are recruiting a team of volunteers to provide a week of "hands-on" service at the Canterbury School in Guatemala this coming June. We will be installing windows and doors and painting the second floor of the Canterbury School which currently serves 120 students, pre-school to 6th grade. Under the auspices of the Bishop of Guatemala, St. Peter's entered into a direct relationship with the school in 2006 providing computers to outfit a computer lab as well as other needed equipment, including a refrigerator. Last year, a group traveled to Guatemala to further establish more personal connections with the school. This year our two churches are joining forces to finish the construction of the second floor of the school which will allow enrollment expansion to 180. On Sunday, **February 22**, the **Rev. Claire Nevin-Field** will be here to share more about the partnership with the Canterbury School and the Diocese of Guatemala. 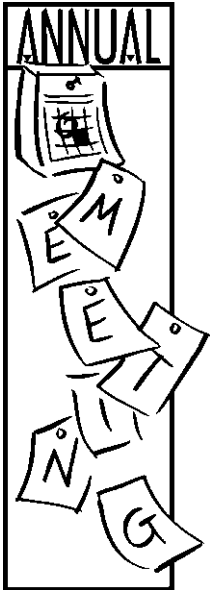

VESTRY CORNER

As part of a new idea of having lay members of Christ Church interview vestry members and write up their responses for the Beacon reading public, David Parke and Grace Layne continue this series by interviewing two Members rotating off the Vestry at the Annual Meeting.

INTERVIEW WITH AYO GANSALLO by David Parke

How often does the vestry meet? The vestry typically meets once a month except if there is need for sessions to deal with important issues.

What is a typical meeting like? Hmm! Not sure any meeting is typical! We usually start with a reading/prayer or spiritual reflection. Then we appoint a “critic” who gets the last say at the meeting, summarizing our discussions and reflecting on the positives and things that could be improved. Finance is always discussed and other important topics for that month, for example if decisions need to be made regarding specific building projects or stewardship/fundraising efforts. Each committee is encouraged to submit a written report and to comment at the meeting when necessary. Vestry really tries to focus on important issues that ensure the smooth running of the Church but also the spiritual direction of the parish.

Who runs the vestry meetings? Typically the Rector runs the meeting, or the Rector’s Warden, as when the Rector was on Sabbatical.

What are the other responsibilities of the Rector’s Warden? Good question. In theory, the Rector’s Warden stands in for the Rector when need arises. But in practice, this role is covered by the other clergy. Another important role is to act as confidant and provide guidance to the Rector on parish issues.



INTERVIEW WITH NATHALIE BARTLE by Grace Layne

It was recently my privilege to interview Nathalie Bartle, a vestry member of Christ Church for the past four years. For anyone who wondered about the source of her fabulous accent, Nathalie was born and “reared” in north Texas. From there, she moved to Boston and remained there for 25 years, earning her master’s degree at Northeastern University and a PhD in developmental psychology from Harvard. Nathalie came to Philadelphia when she married Harvey Bartle III in 1993. A faith community has always been very important in the lives of both Nathalie and Harvey. They visited several churches and, to our good fortune, fell in love with Christ Church.



I asked Nathalie what the vestry does (hoping that I wasn’t the only church member who didn’t know.) She explained that it is the governing body of Christ Church, guiding and overseeing the business and financial life of the church while carefully listening to the needs of the congregation. She said that “we are a relatively small parish with a large and old physical plant, of great historical significance, but also complicated to maintain. While giving much attention to our buildings, we are simultaneously working to sustain and advance the mission of Christ Church for the benefit of our parish and the broader community. We are a vital local parish and, in many respects, a public church. We have to constantly grapple with these issues and with very limited resources.”

Vestry members are not assigned to specific, narrowly defined roles, but are invited to bring each of their individual strengths, knowledge and skills to deal with the complex challenges of the parish. Nathalie has always felt that good leadership supports people so that they can be excited about their roles. Having taught at all levels of education, she is particularly interested in building the educational programs of the church. In her words, “I believe that we must have an excellent Children and Youth educational program in order to attract and keep vibrant young families...which I believe is the future of Christ Church”. In addition, her work in women’s studies: mentoring young women and recognizing and honoring the wonderful women who have served this community over many years, led Nathalie to co-chair the Preservation Trust 2008 Fall Event which honored three exceptional women on the board.

Nathalie has served on the Youth and Family Committee, Vestry Retreat Planning Committee, Women’s Retreat Planning Committee, and, this year, served as the chair of the Annual Giving Campaign Committee. All of this while serving as a professor in Drexel University’s School of Public Health. In these difficult, for some, devastating for others, economic times, Nathalie admitted that the annual campaign was “very challenging”. But, she said that we’ve been very successful in encouraging stewardship, in educating our congregation about giving of “your time, talent and treasures”. She said, “It’s not about how much a person or family can give, but about participating in whatever way they can.”

Nathalie embodies a deep love and commitment to Christ Church. She states that, “It’s been a privilege and an honor to serve on the Christ Church Vestry.” I’m sure that I speak for every member of Christ Church when I express sincere and profound thanks for Nathalie’s incredible service to our church community. When asked what advice Nathalie would give a new vestry member, she said, “Approach this with the belief that you’ve been elected because you have a lot to offer. Your unique skills and knowledge will help to build the team. It’s important to give yourself time to work out your own role. There’s no right or wrong way. Roll up your sleeves! Get involved. Speak up, don’t hold back.”
